The program this month was inspired by the tour of the Clint Walker Honey House that was part of the ABF Convention activities on Saturday January the 13<sup>th</sup>. Dr. Rodney Holloway, former Extension Apiculturist at Texas A&M has been working with Clint Walker in an effort to breed better queens. Dr. Holloway has been invited to come and talk about his contribution to the Walker breeding program and his understanding of the SMarT line of queens.

A very interesting book, "*Robbing the Bees: A Biography of Honey, The Sweet Liquid that Seduced the World*" by Holley Bishop, was given to me at Christmas, and I have been reading it bit by bit since then. It is well-written, very interesting, and gives information about bees and beekeeping and their roles in religion, medicine, science, mythology, and the arts. The author is a hobbyist beekeeper in Connecticut who fell in love with her bees but wanted to include the knowledge she could gain by working with a commercial beekeeper, Donald Smiley of Wewahitchka, Florida. It is a remarkable book of nonfiction that reads like a novel. I recommend it to all our beekeeper members.

Another book I was given recently by the author, 16-year-old Elizabeth Batista, and titled “*Finding Conway, Unlock the Secret*”. is not about bees but is one I can recommend as a good read for all our teen-age youngsters. It is well written with lots of imagination and adventurous escapades involving the three teen-age main characters. Even though I am decades past my teens, I loved the story and had a hard time putting it down. Incidentally, Elizabeth and her parents have been WCABA members in the past and recently renewed their membership
